### Eligibility:

*AGJA Members interested in working for the future of the Gelbvieh breed and improving their own leadership skills are encouraged to apply to serve as the official AGJA Ambassador.*

1. Candidates must be 8 but not yet reached their 20<sup>th</sup> birthday by January 1, 2023.
2. Candidates must complete the official AGJA Ambassador's Application and submit it to the AGA office, postmarked by June 1, 2023.

### Candidate Requirements:

1. Each applicant must be prepared to give a 2-5-minute speech during the AGJA Annual Meeting on Wednesday, July 5, 2023 following the AGJA Board of Director speeches.
2. Requirements are based on the elected candidate's age.

3. Applicant must submit a typed essay of 300-500-word essay on your background and experiences with the Gelbvieh breed.
