

“In 2017 we started running our cattle on a forest grazing allotment that is between 8000’ and 1200’ in elevation. Our death loss that first year due to high altitude sickness or brisket disease was between 15 & 20 percent. In 2018 I saw an advertisement in the Utah Cattlemen’s magazine advertising Balancer bulls that were raised at similar elevation. We started buying those bulls and have seen our death loss from altitude sickness decrease every year since then. During the 2022 grazing season our death loss was less than 2 percent. PAP tested balancer bulls have made a big difference.”
